# Then the Lord God said, "It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make him a helper fit for him."

- Gen. 2:18
- Original solitude
  - Not good man is alone, addressed to "man" as such, DJX adam
  - 2 meanings
    - 1) derived from human nature
    - 2) distinction between male and female
  - Prior to the male-female distinction
  - An existential problem concerning human nature
- "Not good" has two contexts
  - Original solitude
  - Creation of woman
  - Linked with the vocation to cultivate the earth and rule over creation

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#### The First Test of Man

- Original solitude is the first test of man
- Man names the animals
  - In doing this, he gains consciousness of his own superiority over other living creatures
  - Man does not find a fit helper from amongst the animals
- Man is searching for his definition
  - Man has a body which means he is a member of visible creation
  - Man's superiority over animals means that he cannot be entirely identified with visible creation
  - This means that man cannot be defined in terms of visible creation alone

#### Rational Animal

- Man has a visible body, so he is animal
  - "Animal" is the proximate *genus*
- Man cannot be strictly identified with animalia
  - This principle by which man is separated from animalia is rational
  - "Rational" is the specific difference, the *species*
- Hence man according to Aristotelian logic is defined as "Rational Animal

## Subjectivity

#### • Original solitude:

- Alone before God and animalia means that man cannot define himself as either
- Man has self-knowledge. This is also knowledge of reality
- With this knowledge man reveals "himself to himself"
- Subjectivity
  - "Subjectivity constitutes itself through **self-knowledge**" TOB 5:6 (p. 150)
  - Through **self-consciousness** man distinguishes himself from God and animalia
  - This delineation of man from animalia leads to
    - The first definition of man as rational animal
    - The understanding that man is a person
  - Subjectivity characterizes the person

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
