Nakedness Review

- Nakedness signifies the:
 - Original goodness of divine vision in its whole simplicity and fullness
 - Pure value of
 - Man as male and female
 - The human body and its sex
- Gen. 2:25 signifies that there is no antithesis or break between
 - The sensible and spiritual
 - Person and sex
- Interior gaze is the seeing of the man and woman reciprocally through the mystery of creation
 - This gaze creates the fullness of intimacy between persons
- The meaning of original nakedness corresponds to the fullness of the vision of the first man and woman in their understanding the meaning of the body from their communion

Experience and Gift

- Fn 23: an adequate anthropology relies essentially on human experience and cannot be reduced to naturalistic conceptions
- The concepts of created and Creator requires a hermeneutics of gift
 - \circ This gets to the heart of creation
 - This is decisive for the essential truth and depth of original solitude, original unity, and original nakedness

Creation and Gift

- Gen. 1:1, 21, 27, God created (cf. fn 24)
 - o کֵרָא, bara, create
 - Only God performs bara
 - In verse 27, God baras man, creates man. Bara is used 3 times
 - The threefold repetition emphasizes that man is the high point of creation
- God created from nothing, calls being into existence because God is love (cf. 1 John 4:8)
 - Gen. 1:31 creation is very good signifies that love is the divine motive
 - \circ Only love gives rise to the good and is pleased with the good (1 Cor. 13)
 - הַרָא שִׁית הַרָא
 אישִׁית הַרָא
 אישִׁית הַרָא
 - In the beginning (he) created
 - These words signifies that creation is a gift
 - Creation is an act of giving because it comes from nothing

Creation and Gift Continued

- "Every creature bears within itself the sign of the original and fundamental gift." TOB 13.4, (p. 180)
- Gift implies that there is a giver and a receiver, and a relation between the two
 - This relation is demarcated by man being made in the image and likeness of God
 - Giving only has meaning in relation to man
- "Creation is a gift, because man appears in it, who, as an "image of God," is able to understand the very meaning of the gift in the call from nothing to existence." TOB 13.4 (p. 180)
- Creation is the fundamental and original gift
 - Man receives the world as gift
 - The world receives man as gift

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
